IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL MEMBERS

At the January Members' Meeting Tony Jackson, our Chair, provided the following insight into some changes being applied by Lloyds Bank which will impact CGu3a financial processes and the way members payments are handled.

FORTHCOMING CHANGE

Firstly, I have to say that our Treasurer John Smith has guided the committee in considerations to assist our finances but some things related to banking are out of our control and affect the way we do things.

At this time we must however draw your attention to a change which affects us. Lloyds Bank is introducing a range of charges on payments into and out of accounts. The committee will attempt to minimize the impact, but as members you need to be made aware that the use of cheques will begin to incur a charge to the CGu3a. There is also an expectation that cheques will in time be phased out completely.

Some u3as already reject the use of cheques in favour of Bank Transfers. We do have an increasing number of members who pay their annual membership by Bank Transfer and we need to move in that direction. We will not exercise this as a requirement in the forthcoming membership renewal in March/April 2026, but we do encourage you to utilise the Bank Transfer method of payment. This will also be phased in for payments for trips and group activities where appropriate.

Whilst necessary to our u3a cost management, we do realise this is a significant change for some of you. Unfortunately it is unavoidable, but please don't worry about it...we will look to provide guidance to anyone with concerns.

WINGS & WHEELS GROUP

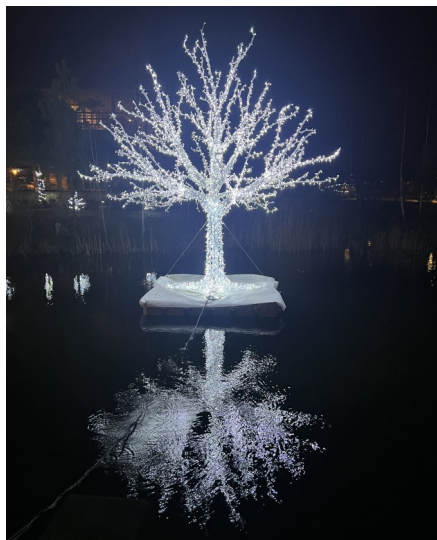
The Group visited the London Transport Museum Acton Depot. This is very different from the public Museum at Covent Garden. This is essentially the storage Depot and repository for the Museum artefacts from tiny items up to buses, Underground trains and other large artefacts. It is not open to the public other than a few open days per year and private group visits like ours. The collection is vast with so many varied items from tickets, ticket machines, station signs, station furniture, electronic signalling equipment and anything and everything that has been used on the transport system or for the management of the system. It even includes semi buildings like ticket booths from stations and the original wrought iron entrance facade to Kensington High Street Station. This is the most fascinating behind the scenes part of London Transport heritage. We had a wonderful guide to inform us about exhibits and were also shown some of the old Underground motor and braking systems being restored and in operation. Another excellent day out.



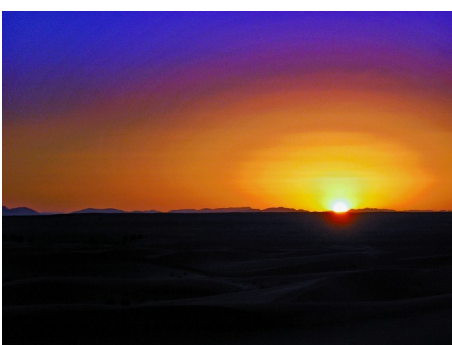

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING TRIPS

Please remember to have with you or wear your CGu3a Membership card and, more importantly, an up to date emergency contact card, preferably kept together on a lanyard. Details of each event can be found in the Newsletter or on our website. Please note the month when tickets are available for trips. Purchase of tickets can be made at our monthly meetings via Joy Dabson, Event Organiser, with payment by Bank Transfer (preferred option) or cheque.

Tickets: Chiswell Green u3a members ONLY for the first month when tickets for trips are on sale. Tickets for guests will be allowed in the second month when they are on sale. This is to avoid waiting lists for members when guests have taken up places. Tickets must be paid for by Bank Transfer (preferred option) within **seven days**, or on the day they are booked with cheques made payable to **CGu3a Social Account**. Please ensure when writing cheques for Trips that you have filled it in EXACTLY correctly, and written your membership number on the reverse. If paying for more than one outing, please send separate Bank Transfers (preferred option) or separate cheques for each event. Cheques can go in the same envelope. If you wish to make a booking for an outing, you can still do so by contacting the Event Organiser (Joy Dabson) by phone (01923 268018) or via our website or email (trips@chiswellgreenu3a.org.uk). All payments should be made within **seven days**.

Pickup point: The coach will be in Tippendell Lane, at the entrance to Greenwood Park. Please be **prompt** – the coach will not wait. A driver's tip is included in the price of the outing. **If you are unable to go on an outing, or running late**, please contact the Event Organiser by phone, up to 10pm the night before the trip landline (01923 268018) or on the day landline FIRST and if no reply then events mobile (07824 671857). Please make a note of this number. If someone is able to take your place, you may be able to have a refund but this cannot be guaranteed. The National Motor Museum

From the earliest motor carriages to classic family saloons, the world-famous National Motor Museum has one of the finest collections of cars, motorcycles and motoring memorabilia in the world. Latest attraction is "We Had One Of Those" showcasing some of the most popular cars from the 1960s through to the noughties and beyond.

Palace House & Gardens

Palace House, once the gatehouse of the medieval Beaulieu Abbey, has been the Montagu family home since 1538. In an idyllic New Forest setting, overlooking the picturesque Beaulieu River millpond, Palace House was remodelled and extended during the 1800s and is now a fine example of a Victorian country house. Inside, its ecclesiastical heritage sets the grand gothic tone for a home bristling with character and adorned with family treasures, portraits, and memorabilia.

Beaulieu Abbey

This 800 year old Abbey was founded by King John in the 13th century before being destroyed on the orders of King Henry VIII in 1538. Owing to the efforts of the Montagu family ancestors, distant relations of these former kings, the now tranquil Abbey is a conserved ruin where visitors have enjoyed its peaceful setting and appreciated the achievements of its medieval builders.

The Secret Army Exhibition

Uncover Beaulieu's history as a top secret training establishment for special agents of the Special Operations Executive (SOE) during World War Two.

Enjoy the Beaulieu grounds on the aerial "Skytrain" or via the open top veteran bus.
